Participate in the County's Redistricting Process



What is redistricting? Redistricting is the regular process of adjusting the county supervisorial voting district lines in accordance with population shifts. In California, public agencies and other organizations must redivide (or redraw) the lines of their districts every 10 years once the results of the Census are released so that each district is substantially equal in population. This ensures that each county supervisor represents about the same number of constituents.

Why is redistricting important to you and me? Redistricting determines which neighborhoods and communities are grouped together into a voting district. Fair, representative districts help ensure that elected officials will be responsive to the voters in their communities.
