
This has been fascinating to learn! I started thinking about what the Demographers/Presenters said: the goal is to create districts with similar views, histories, values, & languages.

Then I reviewed our current map. If kept, it would appear to primarily focus on evening out population vs. population be race; or area-type/demographics. For example, Avenal has much more spanish spoken at home than Corcoran. Corcoran is similar in size to Lemoore vs. Avenal. Plus, theoretically 4 out of 5 representatives could live in Hanford.


This intrigued me to work on creating a new one, & as you know: "easier said, than done."

First, I reviewed the ones submitted & see similar non-demographic goals, but was drawn to those who separated Avenal from Corcoran. I wish I could hear from the map creators to understand their reasoning (e.g. Avenal is vastly different than NAS Lemoore; I don't understand why they would be combined, & separate from the city of Lemoore).







District 2. The rest of the city of Lemoore + NAS Lemoore

District 3. Second biggest city: Corcoran; 3/4 in this district are hispanic





District 4. The rest of the small cities/areas combined: Avenal, Armona, Home Garden, Kettlemen City (& included Highway 41 & I-5, because they primarily see the tourist of our County), Stratford, Santa Rosa Rancheria (since also another tourist destination; & the kids go to Stratford Elementary & Central Union School District, it made sense in my mind to keep these areas together); 3/4 in this district are hispanic & a majority speak spanish at home.
